**Public notice: Yellow Fever prevention measures**

While Rwanda is Yellow Fever free, the Ministry of Health would like to inform the public, that the following measures have been adopted to protect travelers going outside or coming to Rwanda.

1. Travelers (Residents and Non-Residents) coming to Rwanda from Yellow Fever non-endemic countries will not require a Yellow Fever vaccination certificate.
2. Travelers (Residents and Non-Residents) coming to Rwanda from Yellow Fever endemic countries and countries with active Yellow Fever transmission outbreak<sup>2</sup> must present a valid Yellow Fever vaccination certificate upon arrival.
3. All residents travelling to Yellow Fever endemic countries<sup>1</sup> should be vaccinated at least 10 days before travelling.
